

The city centre is a fusion of attractive squares, modern shopping arcades and centres, pubs, bars and restaurants, and fine museums, theatres and art galleries – truly a global city.











SHOP UNTIL YOU DROP!

Love shopping? Then Birmingham is the place for you with the Bullring and Grand Central shopping malls, home to over I60 shops. There is also the Mailbox for designer shopping and in the city centre there are a host of independent arcades and shops including a number of vintage and retro shops.

BIG SPORTS FAN?

Birmingham has a big sporting scene! Edgbaston Stadium is home to Warwickshire Cricket Club and the venue for many international cricket matches. Football fans can have their fill with Birmingham City, Aston Villa, West Bromwich Albion and Wolverhampton Wanderers. Tennis fans can catch the annual LTA women's tournament at The Priory Club – the birthplace of lawn tennis.

NEED A NIGHT OUT?

ART AND CULTURE



Once titled the city of a thousand trades during the industrial revolution, you can visit the Jewellery Quarter where some trades still remain. You can also get your fill of culture at the Ikon Gallery, Barber Institute of Fine Arts, Symphony Hall, City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, Birmingham Royal Ballet and Birmingham Opera Company.

NEED A BIT OF GREEN SPACE?

Feeling that you need a bit of green space? There are a number of outside areas and city parks in and close to Birmingham City Centre including Cannon Hill Park and Sutton Park, the largest urban park in Europe. Sarehole Mill is only a couple of miles out of the city and was the childhood haunt of J.R.R. Tolkien and is said to be the inspiration for The Hobbit and the Lord of the Rings.

ESCAPING THE CITY IS EASY

Need to escape the city? Birmingham is perfectly placed to get yourself around the country – the coast is only a 2 hour drive.



UK Visas and Immigration or UKVI (formerly known as UKBA) is a department of the Home Office responsible for visas and immigration. To study in the UK you will need to have the relevant visa.

You can study English Language for up to II months on a Student Visitor visa. It is important you understand the whole visa process before you apply. The information opposite will give you an idea of how the current process works for Student Visitor visas at the time of this guide being printed. For details regarding Student Route visas visit our website.

We will consider your application to study English on a Student Route visa if:

- · you can demonstrate BI English
- you have an offer for university/college study and require pre-sessional study to improve your IELTS score

VISIT VISA

You can now study up to 6 months of an English Language Course on a visit visa. For further information please contact the international team.

STEP 1

Check if you need a visa

You can check online at the Home Office website if you require a visa. To find out please visit: www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa

STEP 2

Understand the requirements of your visa type

For a Student Visitor visa you must prove that you:

- are 16 or over
- have been offered a place on a course in the UK at an accepted place of study
- have enough money to support yourself without working or help from public funds, or that relatives and friends can house and support you
- · can pay for your return or onward journey

STEP 3

Gather together supporting documents

When you make your visa application you will need to supply the following:

- · a current passport or travel document
- · one passport sized colour photograph
- proof you can support yourself and pay for your course e.g. bank statements, scholarship evidence
- · details of where you intend to stay and your travel plans

Students from certain countries are required to prove they have had tuberculosis testing.

STEP 4

Apply for your visa

- · you must apply online
- you'll have to have your fingerprints and photograph taken at a visa application centre

To apply visit: www.visa4uk.fco.gov.uk
You will be asked to:

- · register an account (you will need an email address)
- fill in the application form in English
- pay for the visa fee online (in most cases)
- print out your form
- · book and attend an appointment at a visa application centre

EUROPEAN ROUTE



EU, EEA AND SWISS NATIONALS

EU (alongside EEA and Swiss) citizens who arrive before the end of the transition period on 31 December 2020, and relevant family members, will be eligible for the EU Settlement Scheme. They have until 30 June 2021 to make an application under that scheme.

EU citizens who do not qualify under EU Settlement Scheme (or other routes protected by the Withdrawal Agreement) arriving in the UK from I January 202I will need to apply and qualify for entry or stay on the same basis as non-EU citizens.

EU citizens will therefore need to get a visa for all activities other than short-term visits and all EU citizens coming to the UK for more than six months will be able to prove other rights and entitlements via online services.

Most EU citizens will not need to attend a Visa Application Centre (VAC) to enrol their biometrics and will instead provide facial images using a smartphone self-enrolment application form.

EU students will need to apply for the new Student Route if they arrive in the UK after 31 December 2020.

ARRIVING IN THE UK

Birmingham airport is only a 15 minute train journey from the city centre. Direct trains from London to Birmingham operate frequently and take around one hour 30 minutes so if you are arriving at London airports such as Gatwick, Heathrow or Stansted you can still travel to the college in a short space of time.

GENERAL ENGLISH LANGUAGE

English levels: IELTS 3.0 to 4.0, CEFR A2 to BI **Hours per week:** 21/25

SUMMARY

This course is for international students at elementary and pre-intermediate level (IELTS 3.0 to 4.0 or CEFR A2 to BI) who want to develop their English skills for progression to General English with Academic skills or vocational courses. There are 25 hours of classes per week.

DESCRIPTION

Your teachers will use a range of different teaching and learning methods to enable you to learn English and communicate in a variety of situations. To improve your speaking vou will work on your conversational skills and on delivering short presentations. You will focus on the accurate use of grammar and pronunciation while broadening your vocabulary in practical real life situations.

This course aims to build up all key English language skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening:

- increase your confidence in the use of English
- support you in gaining a wider range of vocabulary
- enable you to achieve greater accuracy in grammar
- allow you to achieve greater fluency in speaking English and improve your pronunciation

On this programme you will study speaking and listening in a variety of different situations. You will develop your reading skills and improve your written communication.

ENTRY CRITERIA

You should be I6 years of age or over. Although placement is usually based on recognised UKVI IELTs scores, students will be given an assessment on arrival in the UK so that we can accurately record your starting point and map out your learning journey.

Visa requirements:

short-term Student Visa (up to II months).

WHAT NEXT?

Students who complete this programme can progress onto an intermediate level course or onto vocational options across the college.



GENERAL ENGLISH WITH ACADEMIC SKILLS

SUMMARY

This course is for international students at intermediate, upper intermediate or advanced level (IELTS 4.5 to 7.5 or CEFR BI, B2 and CI) who want to develop their English skills for progression to university or to access better career opportunities. There are 25 hours of classes per week.

DESCRIPTION

This course will improve your English Language skills and support you to develop academic skills and prepare you for further study. It will help you to improve skills such as:

- writing assignments
- taking part in discussions
- listening in a variety of situations and contexts
- note-taking in lectures
- · reading academic texts
- exam techniques
 greater accuracy of grammar
- IT based learning
- presentation skills

We will provide you with:

- an initial assessment to identify your starting point
- an individual learning plan which will be personalised to your individual needs and future targets and focus on the main areas you need to improve

- regular assessments, tutorials and reviews to track your progress
- embassy student progress reports
- college Certificate following course completion and the option to take Cambridge qualifications.

SUMMARY

This course is for international students who have a conditional offer for university study with one of our partner universities but do not currently meet the English language requirements. There are 25 hours of classes per week.

DESCRIPTION

The aim of the course is to develop academic language and skills needed for study in higher education establishments. We have a range of pre-sessional courses which allow progression within the range of IELTS 4.5 to IELTS 7.5 (CEFR: BI to CI). The course will help you to communicate more effectively in academic situations using all of the four language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. It will help you to develop your skills in areas such as:

- academic writing
- research and critical thinking
- presentations
- lecture note-taking and application of learning
- formal communication
- · independent study
- interactive discourse and reflection.

We will provide you with:

- an initial assessment to identify your starting point
- an individual learning and study plan which

will be personalised to your individual needs and future targets and focus on the main areas you need to improve

- regular assessments, tutorials and reviews to track your progress
- embassy student progress reports

To successfully complete the pre-sessional course you will need to meet the entry requirements of our partner universities. This will involve completing a set of course assessments and sitting a contributory final assessment.

- personalised support and guidance

ENTRY CRITERIA

You should be I6 years of age or over. You will need a recent IELTS certificate at BI and above in all 4 components. Although placement is normally based on IELTS scores students will be given an assessment on arrival in the UK so that we can accurately record your starting point and map out your learning journey.

Visa requirements:

- Short-term Study Visa
 (II months)
- Student Route: You should hold a conditional offer for one of our partner universities and a recent IELTS UKVI certificate (minimum BI for visa).

Your first enquiry

Before starting your application you should read the information about the course and the college so you make the right choice for your needs. Please contact the international office for further information.

STEP 2

Complete our Student Route application form

Fill in the English Language application form and send it to the international team along with copies of the following supporting documents:

- Certified copies of relevant academic qualification certificates, including recognised international English language qualifications you have taken.
- A clear copy of your passport cover and your personal details page with your picture visible and copies of any previous visas.

STEP 3

Process application

We will let you know we've received your application and then process it.

If you are suitable for the course we will send you an offer letter detailing the start and end dates and fees.

STEP 4

Accepting your offer

The offer letter includes details of how to pay for the course. Payment or proof of sponsorship will be required to accept your place. We will then send you a visa letter.

STEP 5

Visa application

You will now need to make your visa application.

Visa approval or visa refusal

You must report to the college's Digbeth campus upon arrival for induction and enrolment. We will need to see all of the original documentation you previously provided copies of and your passport and visa.
